AIR FORCE EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES

If you're interested in higher education, the Air Force has a number of In-Service programs to help you reach your goals. The following is a summary of Educational Programs available in the Air Force.

COMMUNITY COLLEGE OF THE AIR FORCE (CCAF)

The Community College of the Air Force is an avenue open for all enlisted members to advance their education by earning an Associate in Applied Science degree directly corresponding to their Air Force job. The college is regionally accredited and offers programs in five career areas.

The Community College of the Air Force enables enlisted members to earn a college degree while they are still in uniform. The CCAF, along with the U.S Air Force Academy and other military academies, is a federally chartered, accredited degree granting institution. CCAF is the only institution in the armed services that awards an associate's degree to enlisted personnel. It is also the world's largest community college. Through CCAF, all airmen receive college credit for their technical training, which they can supplement by taking college courses while off duty. CCAF documents your training and education with an official transcript and affords you the opportunity to obtain an

The Community College of the Air Force's accreditation is reaffirmed by the Commission of College's of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. More than 150,000 personnel have earned a CCAF Associate in Applied Science degree.

TUITION ASSISTANCE

When Air Force members register for off-duty courses at an accredited college or university on or off base, the Air Force pays up to 100% of the tuition. The member pays only the cost of books and supplies.

COLLEGE CREDIT BY EXAMINATION

This testing program offers the opportunity to gain college credits by examination at NO COST to active duty personnel. Civilians and dependents are charged a fee. DANTES offers Subject Standardized Tests (DSST), CLEP General, and CLEP Subject Exams. Individual's can earn 3-12 college credits for each exam successfully passed. A maximum of 30 semester hours of degree-applicable examination credit may be applied to satisfy degree requirements.

POST 9/11 G.I. BILL

You will automatically be enrolled in the Post 9/11 G.I. Bill upon enlisting in the Air Force. There are no fees or payments required. The Post 9/11 G.I. Bill is currently estimated at \$86,000 or up to 3 years of full time college and is transferable to your spouse or children and may be broken up. Additionally, while attending school full time after the Air Force you will also be given rent money based on your zip code. This benefit is available for your use up to 15 years after date of discharge.

AIRMEN EDUCATION AND COMMISSIONING PROGRAM (AECP)

The Air Force Airmen Education and Commissioning Program (AECP) allows active duty airmen to complete baccalaureate degree work in a full-time course of study at civilian educational institutions (up to 36 months). Selected airmen remain on full-time active duty status and attend school through a permanent change of station (PCS). Airmen receive the pay of an E-5 and retain all active duty benefits while in this program. Following graduation, airmen attend a three-month Officer Training program to complete commissioning requirements. This program is highly competitive.

AIRMEN SCHOLARSHIP & COMMISSIONING PROGRAM (ASCP)

The Airmen Scholarship & Commissioning Program (ASCP) offers active duty Air Force enlisted personnel the opportunity to earn a commission while completing requirements for their first undergraduate degree as an Air Force ROTC Cadet. If selected, Air Force ROTC pays your tuition, books, and cadets receive \$150.00 monthly non-taxable allowance during the school year. (Total tuition & textbook allowance will vary depending on type of scholarship receive. See your Air Force Recruiter for details). Scholarships are available from 2-4 years in length to qualified candidates in technical, non-technical, and nursing. Pre-health, Biomedical Science Corps, and some foreign language scholarships for 2 & 3 years are also offered.

SCHOLARSHIPS FOR OUTSTANDING AIRMEN (SOAR)

SOAR is a commander's program to select top-flight enlisted members for commissioning. SOAR offers active duty enlisted personnel the opportunity to earn a commission while completing their bachelor's degree as an Air Force ROTC cadet. Those selected separate from the active-duty Air Force, join an Air Force ROTC Detachment, and become a full time college student. The Air Force provides them with tuition and fees scholarship of up to \$15,000 per year, an annual textbook allowance, and a monthly nontaxable stipend. This scholarship is awarded for 2 or 4 years depending upon how many years the individual has remaining in his or her degree program. The program is open to students in any major. Upon graduation and completion of the program, the individual is commissioned as a second lieutenant and returns to Active

BOOTSTRAP

If a member is within one year of completing a degree, they may apply to go on Permissive Temporary Duty (TDY) to complete the degree requirements. First-Term Airmen must be selected for re-enlistment before being eligible to apply for the BOOTSTRAP program.

- If I need to relocate for my job, will your company pay for my moving expenses?
- I'll need work clothes. Will your company provide these, plus give me extra money for their upkeep?

- Will you provide a \$400,000 life insurance policy for about \$26.00 a
- If I want to continue my education, will you pay 100% of my tuition?
- Can you guarantee that I'll never be affected by strikes or layoffs?

- Do you allow unlimited sick leave with full pay?
- If I need legal assistance, will your company provide it at no cost?
- Does your company provide discounts on groceries, shopping, movie and airfares?
- Does your company make available recreation facilities for use by employees?
- If I get married, will you increase my pay?
- Can I retire from your company after 20 yrs and receive a monthly income for the rest of my life?
- Does your company provide a thrift savings plan (401K) to supplement my retirement income?
- Last but not least, is the training your company provides college accredited?
